- To set up and maintain libraries and information centers to facilitate the study of cultural and natural heritage.
- To constitute chapters in India to promote the objectives of the Society.

He traced the history of the organization reminiscing about its founder members and other illustrious celebrities who are associated with over 198 chapters across the country.

Taking obvious pride in his task, the impressive orator tried to elicit the partnership of schools in their varied programmes like Heritage Walks, Heritage Quiz, Museum Tours and Contribution to the Heritage Newsletter 'Virasat'. The enriching talk culminated with a resounding applause generating a lot of interest and enhancing awareness about the programme which we at GPSC hope to translate into concrete action at the school level.
