**Fourth Webinar by Gurgaon Sahodaya on “Winning Outcomes in the Current and Post-Pandemic Education domain for India”**

***Webinar session with Mr. Dilip Mukerjea, a visionary thought leader, breakthrough catalyst, innovation strategist and designer of learning ecosystems.***

***Topic: “Winning Outcomes in the Current and Post-Pandemic Education domain for India”***

***Date: 19th June 2020***

A webinar was conducted on 19<sup>th</sup> June 2020 by Gurgaon Sahodaya under the aegis of the Gurgaon Progressive School Council, on "Winning Outcomes in the Current and Post-Pandemic Education domain for India" by Mr. Dilip Mukherjea. It was fourth in the series of webinars organized for the school leaders and the teaching fraternity of Gurgaon. The objective of this initiation was to empower the teachers to handle the current situation more effectively and enable them to mentor their pupils to emerge as winner by becoming ready for the future.

The minutes of the session are as follows:

1. Ms. Aparna Erry, Chairperson, GPSC and the Principal of D. A. V. Public School, Sector 14, Gurgaon extended a warm welcome to Mr. Dilip Mukerjea. She highlighted Mr. Mukerjea's commendable contribution in the field of education and research as well as the national and international acclaims received by him for his innovative endeavors in promoting quality education. Highlighting the speaker's achievements, Ms. Aparna threw light on Mr. Mukerjea being a trained Marine Engineer who had secured first position in the UK for his final examinations in this field. She also introduced him by talking about he being an author, corporate consultant, success coach to people and internationally acclaimed keynote speaker.
2. Dr Indu Khetarpal, Principal, Salwan Public School, while moderating the session invited Mr. Mukerjea to take over and share his, insightful presentation.
3. Mr. Mukerjea commenced his talk by applauding all the teachers for their wonderful roles in engaging the students effectively by taking the online classes in the challenging times of lockdown post COVID - 19 and encouraged the educators to be "Future Relevant" by mentoring the students to be "Future Prepared".
4. Highlighting that the issue is not the time but the lack of energy, he went on to deliver his presentation by talking about the ten commandments of crucial challenges that confront education today. Some of these challenges are:
  - a) The Information overload causing tremendous confusion and panic.
  - b) Low speed of information processing, causing unaffordable delays.
  - c) Poor retention and recall or Memory Logjam, thus sabotaging learning, as there no learning without memory.
  - d) Frozen status quo that is inability to break from the pack.
  - e) Inability to adapt to competitive challenges, which is famine of ideas along with lack of self-efficacy.
  - f) Inability to read and comprehend, fast, deep, wide, and with varied extensivity.
  - g) Poor idea generation capabilities.
  - h) Poor articulation skills.
  - i) Meager knowledge of the human brain, only learning how to learn fast.
  - j) Inability to convert ideas to action and move ahead from stress to strength and success.
5. Mr. Dilip went on to speak about whether we as educators are rising above the exponential curve, as we are living during exponential times.

6. Talking about the motivation among the pupils, he highlighted that it is imperative that the parents and teachers maintain a realistic expectation and imbibe and instill positivity amongst students for a positive outcome.
7. Referring to the education standards, prevalent in the societies, he encouraged the educators to constantly counsel the pupils and their parents that a dissent is not a failure.
8. A few take away quotes by him were:
  - a) "When the sun comes up, we better be running".
  - b) "Change is difficult, not changing is fatal".
  - c) "Learning at the speed of light".
9. After the session got over, Mr.Mukerjea answered the questions of eager audience, highlighting that our power comes from possessing preeminent learning skills complemented by being able to:
  - recognize and exploit opportunities
  - make informed decisions
  - develop focus
  - practice daring
  - have confidence
  - develop convictions and
  - propagate a powerful philosophy of life
10. Ms. Arti Chopra, Secretary GPSC and Principal, Amity International School, Sec 46 Gurgaon expressed her gratitude to Mr. Dilip Mukherjea for conducting such an interesting session and motivating the school leaders and teachers of Gurgaon.


